Erasmus + Mobility in Turkey

As one of the lucky ones I had the opportunity to take part in the first mobility of the second Erasmus+ program in the school.

On January 6, 2019, at 9 am, we were gathered excitedly in front of the school. We traveled to the airport by transfer. We said goodbye to our family before heading to Budapest. When we arrived at the airport, we searched for the gate to enter, but we had to go through border control before. After that, we still had some time and we could look at the stores. With the time approaching, we headed towards the gates. Thanks to the previous Erasmus program, I flew to Lithuania so it wasn't a new experience, but it was definitely exciting. 3 students have never flown before so it was good to watch their reaction when we got off the air. There were monitors on the plane for every seat on which we could watch movies and videos so we haven't even noticed that we arrived in Istanbul. The airport is one of the largest, so we've traveled long distances using moving walkways. We tried to walk backwards on this walkway and it looked like we stayed in one place, trust me we had an amazing time on this thing. Our final destination was Samsun where we landed in the evening. We went to the hotel by a transfer from the airport. Having settled in our room, we could finally relax after this busy day.

When we got up we saw that the view was beautiful. Breakfast (like all meals here) started with tea, which the Turkish people call çay. After breakfast we went to the school by bus which took about 2 hours. Only girls studied at this school, which was strange at first, but we got used to it quickly. The school was



modern and sophisticated. The walls of the school were covered with Muslim holy places such as Kaba stone and several famous and respected people like Mustafa Kemal Atatürk and so on. We could gain insight into a lesson. Later, the countries participating in the program presented

their country, town and school. After the presentations we had lunch at the school canteen. We were very surprised by the shoe nets which we had to put on our feet to keep the canteen clean. The food was really great but the interesting thing was how the water was packaged. We got water in small plastic cups and we had to tear off the foil on top of it. After lunch we visited a hydroelectric power station. The power plant was monumental, its turbines were deep inside the mountain and they could only be reached by a long tunnel. A mockup illustrated how the power plant works. After the visit we returned to the hotel. The dinner was in the restaurant next to the hotel, where we could taste traditional Turkish dishes and here we really experienced the Turkish hospitality and the waiters were literally feeding us. In the two-hour dinner we were very tired so we returned to the hotel and were preparing for the next day.

The next day we went back to the school after breakfast. When we arrived, the project logo was selected. we chose the most appropriate logo by voting. After the students showed us around the school. In their music room, they performed traditional music which was beautiful. After the performance, we went into a natural gas processing plant where it was shown how natural gas is being used and we have also received a presentation about how we can save



energy at home and around us. After that, we checked the pipes and the control center, then we went back to the

hotel. The following day, the participants of the program gave a presentation which was based on the use of renewable energy, followed by a little volleyball with the students. Later that day we could buy and see the sights in the city center.

The next day we got up to admire the sunrise and the view on the pier. Then we headed towards the mountains because we visited Amasya. Here we visited various museums, which showed us the Turkish history from the beginning. Then there was a little hike up on the mountain to the Tombs of the Kings, where the view was breathtaking. On the way back to Samsun, the bus driver turned on and the most popular music from each participating country. Everyone had a great time. The next day was a relatively short day that began with a visit to one of Samsun's bazaar. There were everything you can imagine here and prices were cheap. Later we went to a museum presenting the history of Samsun, where we got to know the customs of this place and the life here. Later we were in the largest mall in the southern Black Sea region. Before we entered, the security looked through our bags and checked our body just like at the airport, which was a little worrying but understandable. At the end of the week we went to a restaurant where we ate traditional dishes and they handed out the certificates. Later, we danced together and had some fun. After coming back to the hotel, we talked a little bit with the foreigners, but we had to say goodbye to them very soon, because our plane took off early. Returning home seemed much shorter than coming to Turkey.

Overall, I was enriched with interesting information and experience, and it was a great opportunity for me to develop and use my English language skills. My knowledge about energy saving had greatly increased and now I'm more aware of the different kinds of renewable energy sources and how we could implement them in my country. Now I'm more interested in this topic and finally understand how important it is for the world as a whole. I also got to know a new, very different culture that I will never forget.

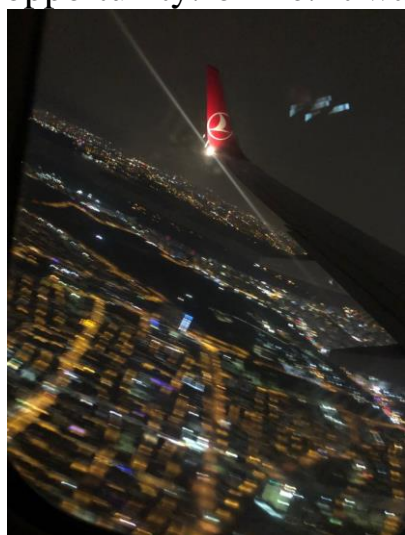

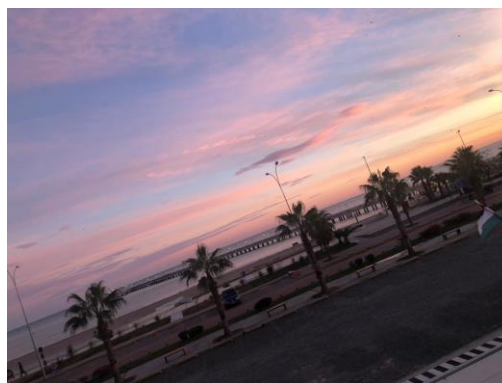

Our goal was Samsun, where the Turkish girls waited us and the other teams from four countries. We stayed in a beautiful hotel. When we got up



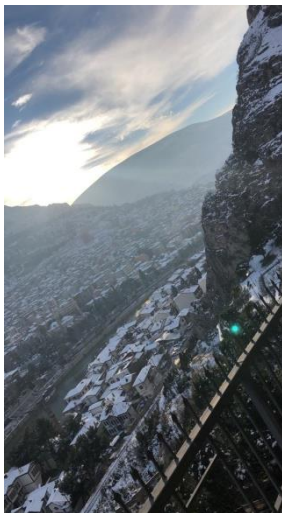
we saw the beautiful view of the sea.
